Clip Art for Leather

alt.binaries.clip-art

A place to find all sorts of patterns for leather projects. If you have access to a computer, then you can get some quite interesting and varied clip art (line drawing, pictures, graphics, and lettering) to use on leather projects. The art work is already in electronic format and can easily be adjusted in size and color. The only caveat is that most of the work may or may not be copyrighted. So, this type of clip art is best used for projects for your own personal use. If you want to use copyrighted material for sale, then you must track down the owner of the material ...or... refer to a PSLAC Members Only article on **Designing Your Own Work**. The article goes into the steps necessary to alter the work enough to make it a new design.

For those not familiar with Net Newsgroups you will find that there many specialty groups that post email, text message and pictures on a variety of subjects.

New groups are formed and lost on a daily basis, but some of the more popular groups continue -- alt.binaries.clip-art is such a



group.

The Newsgroups are pretty easy to set up and some browsers (e.g. Netscape, Internet Explorer with Outlook Express) have access to the Newsgroup Servers. There are even free programs that are just set up to access the Newsgroups, such as: **FreeAgent** (http:///www.forteinc.com)

On Netscape, for example, the EDIT pull down menu has a section on PREFER-ENCES for MAIL & NEWSGROUPS and the NEWSGROUP SERVERS. Check with your Internet Service Provided for the Newsgroup Server and you will soon be on your way to exchange information in the your area of interest, be it golf ball collecting or the latest conspiracy theories.


Special Leather Plaque

(ed. note: I was given a sample of this technique, and promptly lost it. Use your imagination, since the description by **Sister Rachel** is quite clear.)

A number of years ago, our office was going to close and operations were to be moved to Seattle. Our General Manager decided to retire. He had been with the company for 35 years and a number of people had worked under his management. We wanted to make a card that would be different, but large enough for everyone to sign.

Thus was here my idea. One of the men made a larger Oak plaque approximately 14" x 18". I cut a piece of 4-5oz leather to fit on the plaque. I asked each person to sign their name on plain onion skin paper. I then traced each name onto the cased leather in a random manner. A light coat of Hi-liter applied to the leather brought out the names very clearly. A metal plaque (approx. 4" a 5") with his name and the years worked with the company was placed in a cut-out in the center.

Needless to say, Mr. Barber was both surprised and pleased with a lasting memento of his years as a manager.


