
The Puyallup Fair Results



Leather Craft Magazine Binders

I started to collect (read obsession) leather magazines with the first issue of the LC&SJ. When I used to live in Mountlake Terrace, I used to go to my local Tandy store in North Seattle every week waiting for the next LC&SJ to arrive, but I was out of town one month and I missed one. Luckily the Burien Tandy store still had a copy, so from that moment on I subscribed to the LC&SJ.


Then I met Bill Churchill and we talked about some projects in some older magazines that he had acquired. Those magazines were: The Craftsman, Leather Craftsman, and Make It with Leather. Bill proudly showed me some of his article that was included in those old magazines.

Bill began to offer some of those magazines for sale at various PSLAC meetings and I purchased a few and filed them away. Finally, after Bill's death, his family offered many of the leather magazines for sale at our annual PSLAC Bar-B-Que, where I obtained even older magazines. All was fine until I discovered eBay while here in England. Searching eBay for the key words: leather, magazine, and leathercraft lead me to many people selling magazines one at a time or in groups as large as ten or twenty. Since the cost of mailing packages over seas is so expensive, I had the seller ship the magazines to my daughter in the States. I tried to keep track of the magazines and which issues I was purchasing and which I had acquired over the years, but my records were less than complete, so I wasn't sure if I had obtained a complete set.

Then, I ran across a four volume set, covering 16 years, of all The Craftsman and the Leather Craftsman magazines. Those magazines were in three ring binders that were covered with carved leather. My bid was not successful and felt that I had missed out on a unique item.

I thought nothing more of it and after a while I received an email asking if I was still interested in the items. Perhaps the person who out bid me failed to make the transaction.

They were being offered to me for 200 dollars. I couldn't write the check fast enough, but sadly, most of my eBay transactions are sent to my daughter to save on shipping charges to England so it had to wait several




months before I could even see them.

Now it is up to me to design and build some appropriate binders for the rest of the collection. Any suggestions?




October Meeting Demonstration

We'll be doing a Pattern Layout Demonstration before the October meeting, from 12:00 to 2:00, Sunday, Oct. 10th. I'll bring a large roll of heavier weight mylar, good for leather cutting patterns and some examples of lighter weight mylar, better for tracing designs onto leather. I'll bring my collection of patterns I've made over the years. You'll need to just bring a pencil with a medium to fine point, an erasure, a pair of scissors and a 12 to 18 inch ruler. I've found a particular style ruler, from the C-Thru Ruler Co. that has worked well for me - having it see-through and the lines running all the way across make it easier to line up (see picture and description below). I've found these at Michael's and at various art supply companies. I'll have a handful for people to use and/or buy, at the demonstration and will show you why I like this style . I'd like to have people try laying out a simple bag/purse pattern and one for a knife, and anything else you might like to try, if we have time (such as a pattern for a fitted leather cell phone case?).

From Everett: South on I-5 to 405 South, or to I-90, going east:

From I-90 get off on exit 17/Front St., and bear right onto Front Street. At the third stoplight, turn left onto E Sunset Way, then see below:

Taking Hwy 18 from around Auburn to Issaquah

Get on Hwy 18 going East, from Auburn, it's about 12 miles to Maple Valley, then at about 2 ½ miles after Maple Valley, look for the turn off to Issaquah Hobart Rd SE, turn onto ramp 276th Ave SE and go 0.6 miles, bear left onto



Issaquah Hobart Rd SE. It's about 8 ½ miles from there to Issaquah. Hobart becomes Front Street S, which takes you into downtown Issaquah. Turn right onto E Sunset Way, then see below:

After turning onto E Sunset Way:

go two blocks (past the Police and Fire Stations), turn left onto 2nd Ave SE, go past the old Senior Center building on your left, and a baseball field, then left onto NE Creekway, go almost to the railroad tracks. The new Issaquah Valley Senior Center is a brick building on your left, parking in front of it. There is also parking behind, from Sunset, turn left into the parking area, right before the Police Station (look for a large parking sign on your left), and follow it till you see a kids play ground.
