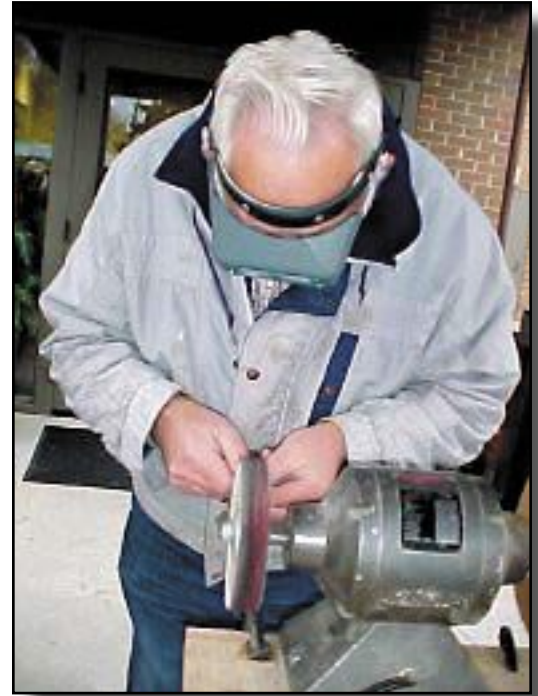

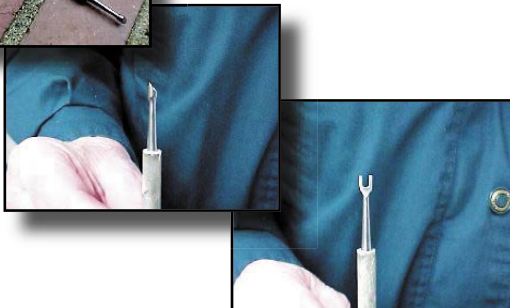

Dusty,

Thanks for asking about our company – I feel like I know you because I've seen your picture for years in the PSLAC journal. I was glad to have the chance to meet Bill a few years ago, through e-mail, and between us we figured out that he was a cousin to my Mom, Mary Churchill, from back here in the east. Small world. It was fun to get to 'know' him through messages, and to swap family stories. We donated some tooling leather pieces to PSLAC for youth programs a few years ago and would love to do that again in Bill's honor, so please contact us if you plan to have a youth event of some sort.

Back when I used to converse with Bill

our company was pretty small, but we've grown and now have some contracts that have helped our business to become more of a regular supplier of craft supplies to our customers. You may have heard about the high-quality tooling sides being produced in England recently by **Pittards**, almost all of which goes to use on **Louis Vuitton** bags. **Brettuns Village** now has a contract to handle odd lots, overruns, and leftovers from that production, and we also handle all of the cutting scrap from Vuitton. This has really helped us keep a good supply of high quality tooling sides and larger scrap pieces (sold by the pound) in stock.

We also have contracts with 4 tanneries and a total of 14 leather product manufacturers throughout the US, selling off their product trials, returns, odd lots, etc. There's a lot of leather here, as our inventory list currently shows right around 23,000 sides in stock. We're also starting to carry some hair-on hides like calf, goat, and sheep for our customers that use these items. On the hardware side we carry a variety of rivets, lacing hooks, eyelets, and other items when we can get them through our contracts.

The focus here has been to stick to our roots – our company was formed to help leather product makers in New England find a better way to move excess inventory out of their way. *We basically got in between their stockrooms and the local landfill.* One

thing has lead to another, and now we're finding ourselves filling about 100 orders per day. We still sell a lot of scrap leather by the pound, and we custom cut smaller pieces for customers that just need to cover one seat or whatever. Get the inventory, keep it inexpensive, and move it out quickly. That's the sum total of our business plan, and so far it seems to be working. One other important thing – we've always had free shipping for all orders within the 48 contiguous states, which seems to make our customers happy.

**For several years we've offered a discount of 10% to PSLAC members, and a few have taken us up on it.** We have a small ad that runs in the PSLAC newsletter every month, and if I remember correctly it seems like we probably owe the group some money for running that ad. If so, just let us know and we'll take care of it.

Again, thanks very much for contacting us here at Brettuns Village. We may be on the wrong coast but we sure work hard to take care of our customers all over the world.

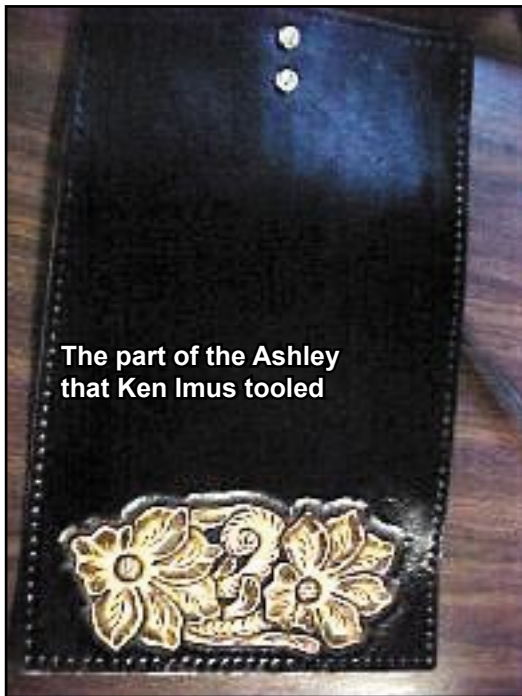

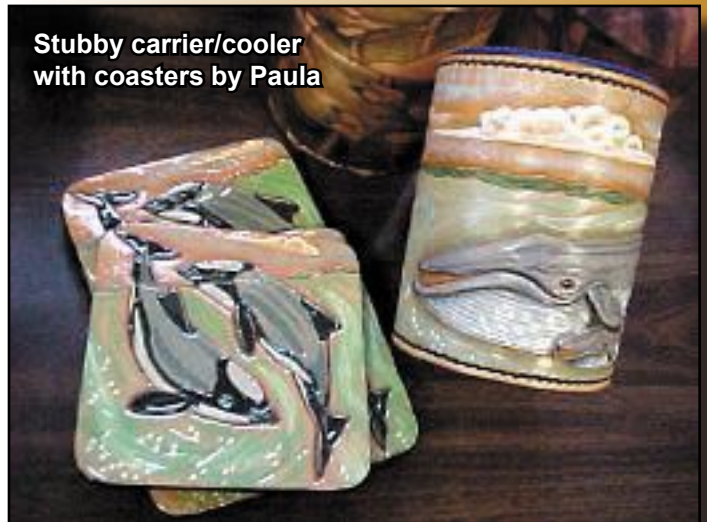

Try some fonts and purchase those that work the best for your projects for sale.

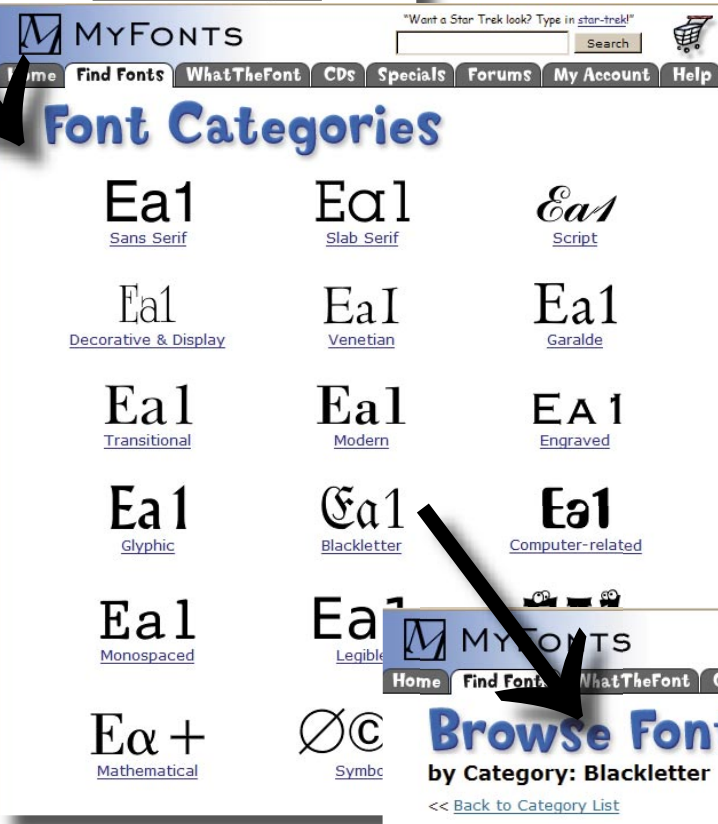

As you well know, **Bill Churchill** had a fondness for the art form of the character font. He used initials as complete decorations on items like day planners.

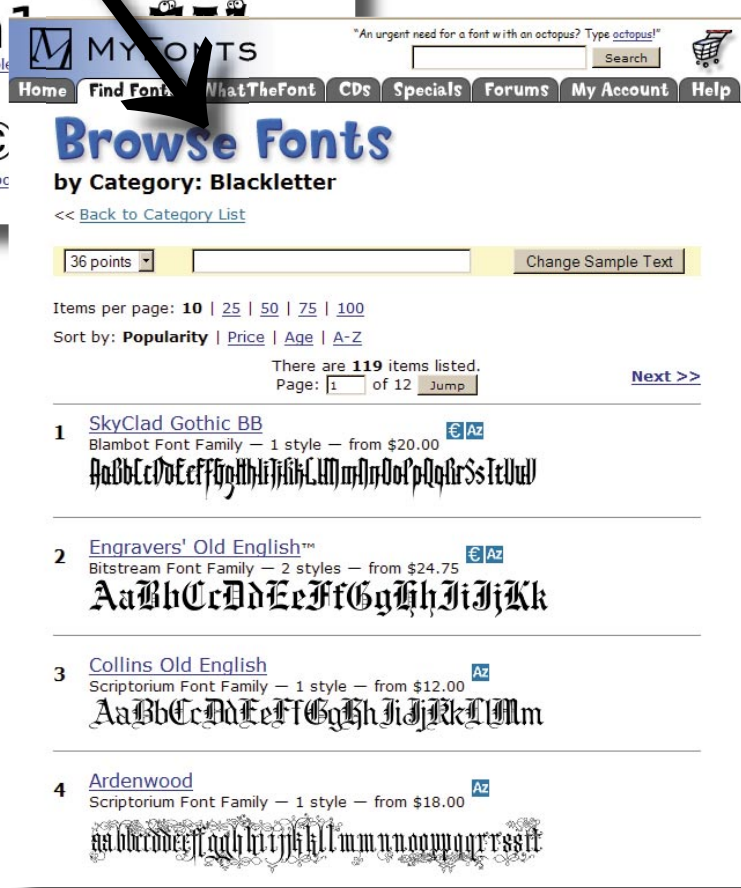
While looking for some more letterpress lead type for embossing leather, a reference to the **MyFonts.com** was made to help identify the letterpress type that was for sale.

**Taking I-90**

**From Auburn:** come north on Hwy167, or I-5, then I-405 north, then onto I-90, going east:

**From Everett:** South on I-5 to 405 South, or to I-90, going east:

From I-90 get off on exit 17/Front St., and bear right onto Front Street. At the third stoplight, turn left onto E Sunset Way, then see below:

**Taking Hwy 18 from around Auburn to Issaquah**

Get on Hwy 18 going East, from Auburn, it's about 12 miles to Maple Valley, then at about 2 ½ miles after Maple Valley, look for the turn off to Issaquah Hobart Rd SE, turn onto ramp 276th Ave SE and go 0.6 miles, bear left onto Issaquah Hobart Rd SE. It's about 8 ½ miles from there to Issaquah. Hobart becomes Front Street S, which takes you into downtown Issaquah. Turn right onto E Sunset Way, then see below:
