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

Paula's Demonstration on Inverted Carving

The demonstration for the January PSLAC meeting was given by **Paula Marquis**. It was on **Inverted Carving**. She also had some practice pieces cased and with the pattern already cut with the swivel knife.

First, when deciding to do an inverted carving select a clean piece of leather, without any scratches, wrinkles, smudges, or other blemish. Then make sure that your fingernails are cut very short and smoothly filed on the ends. Take off your watch, roll up your sleeves if wearing a long sleeve shirt. You want nothing to touch the leather to leave any kind of mark or smudge.

When cutting the pattern lines with the swivel knife, be very careful to follow the pattern lines, and if by chance you move off the line, make sure that it is on the side of the line which is going to be beveled. Any mark or smudge on the leather is there to stay.

When beveling, only the outer lines of the pattern are beveled on the inside surface. The rest of the pattern is beveled and tooled in the normal fashion. Watch the transition points where the beveling goes from inside

to outside the cut line. This should be a very little over on both sides so that there

is a smooth transition, not an abrupt one. After all the beveling is completed, smooth the beveling halo with a modeler. Tool and finish the inside of the pattern in the normal manner.





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
